All passengers and crew will be required to adhere to the Coach Company's COVID-19 Safety Plan whilst travelling in the Coach, and the Resort's COVID-19 Safety Plan whilst staying in the Resort. These plans have been devised by NSW Health. At the time of this brochure going to print, the requirements by NSW Health for this tour are unknown, as the recommendations, requirements and rules frequently change, due to COVID-19 situation at the time. If there are certain regulations or recommendations that we are required by NSW Health to notify you about, we will do so prior to the departure of the tour. By booking to travel on this tour, it will be assumed that you're willing to conform with these requirements at the time of travelling on this tour.

**Day 1: Sunday 16 October 2022 – The Central Coast, Sydney, South Goulburn, Yass Service Centre, Holbrook, Albury**

**Inclusions: Two-Course Generous-Serve Alternate Drop Dinner & 4.5-Star Accommodation**

This morning, between 5.00am and 6.30am, you'll be collected from either outside or close to your home (this service will be available to most people living east of the Pacific Highway between Lake Munmorah and Kariong), and head to **Uncle Leo's Roadhouse**, near Crossroads. Upon arrival you'll have time to enjoy a coffee and use the restrooms, before, at around 9.30am, boarding the luxury coach for your journey to the Albury region. After departing from Uncle Leo's Roadhouse you'll join the Hume Highway, and head straight to the famous **Trapper's Bakery**, in **South Goulburn**. After arriving at the Bakery at around 11.15am, you'll have time to enjoy a refreshment or two, prior to reboarding the coach to head to **Yass Service Centre**. Upon arrival you'll have time for another rest stop, while the Canberra-based passengers join the tour at this point. You'll depart from the Service Centre at around 1.30pm, to head to the town of **Holbrook**, where, again, you'll have time to stretch your legs and, if you choose, to enjoy a refreshment. After departing from Holbrook you'll head straight to **Albury**, where, at around 5.15pm, you'll arrive at the 4.5-Star **Quality Resort Siesta Albury**. After disembarking from the coach you'll be shown to your luxury **Deluxe Room** to await the arrival of your luggage by one of the Resort's porters. After settling into your room, you'll make your way into the Resort's **Bullring Restaurant & Bar** by 6.15pm, where you'll be served a delicious **Two-Course Generous-Serve Alternate-Drop Dinner**. For Main Course you'll be served either Roast Pork with Crackling and Apple Sauce, accompanied by Baked Potato, Baked Pumpkin, Cauliflower Cheese, Steamed Peas, Steamed Carrots and Gravy, or Roast Beef, accompanied by Baked Potato, Baked Pumpkin, Cauliflower Cheese, Steamed Peas, Steamed Carrots and Gravy. The Vegetarian option will be Du Puy Lentil, Roast Pumpkin and Kale Salad, with a Caramelised Fig Dressing. For Dessert you'll be served either Pavlova with Mixed Berries, a Berry Coulis and Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Plain Cheesecake with Mixed Berries, a Berry Coulis and Vanilla Ice-Cream. Following Dinner, Tea, Coffee and Chocolates will be available.

**Day 2: Monday 17 October 2022 – Albury, Hume Dam, Tallangatta, Corryong, Walwa, Albury**

**Inclusions: Full Hot & Cold Breakfast, Entry & Informative Talk at the Man From Snowy River Museum, Two-Course Generous-Serve Pre-Ordered Dinner & 4.5-Star Accommodation**

Between 6.30am and 8.00am you'll enjoy a **Full Hot & Cold Breakfast** in the Resort's **Cantina Breakfast Room**, prior to departing from the Hotel at around 8.10am, to head to the nearby **Hume Dam**. A triumph of engineering when it was completed in 1936, the Dam caught the public imagination in the same way the Snowy Mountains Scheme did at its completion. Between 1950 and 1961 the Dam was enlarged, which created a lake size, when full, of 202 square kilometres, holding a volume of water six times the size of Sydney Harbour. At the time, the Dam was the biggest in the southern hemisphere, and one of the largest in the world. Today the Dam continues to play a critical role in capturing winter and spring rainfall from the Australian Alps, and releasing it to regulate the flow of the **River Murray**. As well as irrigation, the Dam supplies stock and household needs for towns and landholders along the Murray River across three states, and is used for flood mitigation and hydro-electricity. Upon arrival, at around 8.30am, you'll have time to stroll onto the Dam Wall, and to visit one or more of the nearby lookouts, to take in the view of the Dam. You'll depart from the Dam at around 9.05am to head to the little town of **Tallangatta**. The town's name is believed to be the local Aboriginal word for Kurrajong trees. There are two Tallangattas. The "Old Town", which is now nothing more than signage and a lookout beside the Murray Valley Highway, was physically removed from the Murray River valley when Hume Dam was completed. The transfer of the town was completed on the 29<sup>th</sup> of June 1956. Thus the second Tallangatta came into existence, 8kms to the west of the original town. Upon arrival, you'll have over an hour to explore the small shopping centre, and to enjoy a refreshment or two in one of the town's bakeries or cafes. After departing from Tallangatta at around 10.45am, you'll head through a mixture of rural farmland and bushland, until you arrive at the **Man From Snowy River Museum**, in the little town of **Corryong**. Pioneering families of the 1960s had a vision to preserve the early history of their local area. Today the commitment of the community to carry on this mission is apparent in the quality of the museum, and the volunteers who give their time to run it. The museum has a varied and extensive collection, including nationally significant items such as those owned by Jack Riley, the man who inspired Banjo Paterson to write his now famous poem "The Man From Snowy River", household items from 1800 to 1960, Jim Simpson's POW knitted rug, the Corryong Hospital collection, horse-drawn equipment, costumes, textiles, quilts, business machines and equipment, gold and tin mining exhibits, local buildings, such as the school, police station, bank and gaol, and much more! Upon arrival, at around 11.45am, you'll be given an **Informative Talk** about the Museum, before having time to wander through the complex to take in the exhibits. You'll depart from the Museum at around 1.00pm, to head a few metres down the street to the centre of Corryong. Located on the Murray Valley Highway, just south of the New South Wales-Victoria border, Corryong is a rural service town that promotes itself as the true home of "The Man From Snowy River". It is a pleasant destination, nestled in a valley, and surrounded by National Parks and wilderness areas. It is claimed the name Corryong comes from the Jaitintang Aboriginal word "cooyong", which means "bandicoot". There are other interpretations of the word which include "a possum skin garment" and "red ochre body paint". Upon arrival in the town you'll have around 90 minutes to stroll, browse, and to enjoy lunch in one of the town's cafes, bakeries or pubs. After departing from Corryong you'll commence the return journey to the Resort. En route you'll call into the tiny town of **Walwa** for a rest stop. There is a general store in the town, should you wish to grab a drink, ice-cream or something else that takes your fancy. Named after the Walwa pastoral run, the town's name is thought to have derived from an Aboriginal word describing a "place of waters". With a population of less than 400 people, in days gone by the town was best-known for its butter and cheese factory, and for its open-cut tin mine. Today the town is best-known for agriculture and tourism, due to being situated less than one kilometre from the Murray River. You'll depart from the town at

### Day 2: Monday 17 October 2022 (cont.)

around 3.45pm to return to the Resort, arriving at around 5.15pm. After having time to freshen up, you'll make your way into the Resort's **Bullring Restaurant & Bar** by 6.15pm, where you'll be served a delicious **Two-Course Generous-Serve Pre-Ordered Dinner**. For Main Course you'll have the option of either Pesto Chicken - Grilled Chicken Breast, served with Herb Crushed Potatoes, Steamed Greens, and a Creamy Pesto Sauce, or Cider Braised Lamb Shank, served on Golden Mash with Steamed Seasonal Greens and a Hearty Jus, or Pan-Seared Salmon Fillet, served on Herb Roasted Chat Potatoes, with Steamed Vegetables, and Mustard Hollandaise. The Vegetarian option will be Butternut Pumpkin & Sage Risotto. For Dessert, you'll have the option of Raspberry and White Chocolate Cheesecake, with Raspberry Compote, Caramelised White Chocolate and Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Blood Orange Lychee Flan, with Blood Orange Gel, Lime Meringue and Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Freshly Chopped Fruit Salad, with Vanilla Ice-Cream. Following Dinner, Tea, Coffee and Chocolates will be available.

### Day 3: Tuesday 18 October 2022 – Albury, Mount Beauty, Mount Hotham, Myrtleford, Albury

**Inclusions:** *Full Hot & Cold Breakfast, Two-Course Generous-Serve Pre-Ordered Dinner & 4.5-Star Accommodation*

Between 6.30am and 7.30am you'll enjoy a **Full Hot & Cold Breakfast** in the Resort's **Cantina Breakfast Room**, prior to departing from the Resort at around 8.10am, to head to the little town of **Mount Beauty**. This town is located in the rich, fertile Kiewa Valley, at the foot of Victoria's highest mountain, Mt Bogong (1986 metres), on the edge of the Alpine National Park. Although the area had been occupied by Europeans for over 100 years, it wasn't until 1946 that the population really grew, when workers arrived to help construct hydro-electricity infrastructure in the area. This resulted in the construction of many new homes, as well as new shops, and other urban facilities. In recent times, the town has become an ideal destination for visitors wanting to bushwalk, admire the local flora, and to ski during the winter. The area has extensive alpine vegetation, with more than 300 plant species, snow-gum woodlands, and an alpine herb field, which offers vibrant wildflower displays in spring. It is also home to such rarities as the mountain pygmy possum, the broad-toothed rat, and the alpine water skink, as well as wombats and many varieties of birds. After arriving in the town you'll have time to explore the little shopping centre, and to enjoy a refreshment or two in the town's bakery or café. You'll depart from Mount Beauty at around 10.00am to head through some of the most stunning and picturesque high-country scenery in Australia! Within minutes of departing from the town you'll stop at **Sullivans Lookout**. This Lookout provides the visitor with a breathtaking view of Mount Bogong, Mount Beauty and the picturesque Kiewa Valley. You'll have time to take in the scene and grab some photos. After reboarding the coach you'll head another kilometre or so up the mountain to visit **Tawonga Gap Lookout**. Again, this Lookout offers expansive and stunning views of Mount Bogong and the Kiewa Valley, as well as Mount Emu. After having time to enjoy the vista and take some photos, you'll reboard the coach at around 11.00am to head through more picturesque alpine scenery, before joining the famous **Great Alpine Road**. A few minutes later you'll arrive at Pioneer Park, in the little village of Harrietville, where you'll have around 20 minutes for a rest stop, prior to reboarding the coach to continue on the Great Alpine Road towards the famous Mount Hotham ski resort. Prior to arriving in Mount Hotham, you'll visit **Danny's Lookout**. This Lookout truly offers one of the best views of Australia's High Country. Visitors to the area claim that this Lookout offers the best view in the region. You'll have sufficient time to be amazed by scenery, and revel in the sweeping views in every direction. After departing from the Lookout, you'll head straight to the nearby **Mount Hotham Resort**. At 1861 metres above sea level, Mount Hotham was named by the Government botanist, Ferdinand von Mueller, after the Governor of Victoria, Sir Charles Hotham, in 1854. The first European road or track to Mount Hotham was surveyed not from the direction of Melbourne, but from Gippsland. In 1851 gold was discovered at Omeo, and during the next few years gold was also discovered in the Ovens Valley. In 1860 gold was also discovered at Crooked River, south of Mount Hotham. The getting of supplies to these alpine mining settlements was in many instances done from Omeo, by tracks that followed ridge lines. The tracks to Harrietville (in the Ovens Valley) and Crooked River, intersected at Mount St Bernard, about 8 kilometres south-east of Mount Hotham. Accommodation was provided at the St Bernard Hospice (1863-1939). A coach service from Omeo began in 1884. After the decline of mining and the opening of the Ovens Valley railway to the town of Bright in 1890, the coach road deteriorated. It was not until the 1920s that ski clubs from Wangaratta and Bright moved beyond the (then) leading ski resort, Mount Buffalo, to the Mount Hotham area. The Country Roads Board upgraded the road and built a patrol hut and accommodation in a saddle east of Mount Hotham, known as Hotham Heights. The road you'll be travelling on between Harrietville and Mount Hotham underwent substantial repair in 2013, following bushfire and land slippage caused by heavy rain. After arriving in Mount Hotham Resort you'll have over an hour to take a stroll, and to enjoy lunch. The main eating venue in the Resort is "The General" – a general store and hotel. The venue offers a wide choice of food, including sandwiches, wraps, snack, and hot meals. You'll depart from Mount Hotham Resort at around 2.30pm, to head back down the mountain towards the busy town of **Myrtleford**. Upon arrival you'll have around 30 minutes to stretch your legs and grab a drink or ice-cream. After departing from Myrtleford you'll return to the Quality Siesta Resort Albury, arriving there at around 5.45pm. After having time to freshen up, you'll make your way into the Resort's **Bullring Restaurant & Bar** by 6.30pm, where you'll be served a delicious **Two-Course Generous-Serve Pre-Ordered Dinner**. For Main Course you'll have the option of either Stuffed Chicken Breast – Chicken Breast stuffed with Camembert and Sundried Tomatoes, accompanied by Roasted Chat Potatoes, Steamed Vegetables and a Creamy Garlic Sauce, or Crumbed Lamb Cutlets, served on Potato Mash with Steamed Vegetables and a Hearty Jus, or Pan-Seared Barramundi, served on Potato Mash with Steamed Greens, and a Lemon Beurre Blanc. The Vegetarian option will be Sweet Potato Gnocchi with charred Broccoli Florets and Garlic Sage Butter. For Dessert you'll have the option of either Rich Chocolate Pudding, served with Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Lemon Tart, served with Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Freshly Chopped Fruit Salad, served with Vanilla Ice-Cream. Following Dinner, Coffee, Tea and Chocolates will be served.

**Please Take Note:** In the event that on the day of this tour, snow, rain or fog is forecast in the High Country, the trip to Mount Beauty and Mount Hotham Resort will be cancelled. Instead, you'll spend the day visiting the popular tourist towns of **Yackandandah, Beechworth, Bright and Myrtleford**. Any such decision will be made prior to departing from the Resort on this morning.

### Day 4: Wednesday 19 October 2022 – Albury, Rutherglen, Albury

**Inclusions:** *Full Hot & Cold Breakfast, Informative Talk at Wrenwood Farm Shop, Gallery & Nursery, Informative Talk & Whisky Tasting at Corowa Whisky & Chocolates, Full Menu Choice Dinner & Entertainment by Swag n Billy Bush Band at Kinross Woolshed Hotel & 4.5-Star Accommodation*

Between 6.30am and 8.30am you'll enjoy a **Full Hot & Cold Breakfast** in the Resort's **Cantina Breakfast Room**, prior to departing from the Resort at around 8.40am, to head to **Wrenwood Farm Shop & Gallery**, on the outskirts of Albury. Set between the rolling hills of Bungawannah and the Murray River, the business stocks an interesting range of produce, antiques, vintage wares, jewellery, gifts, jams, preserves, honey, bird houses, and much more! Before disembarking from the Coach, the owner, Lizabeth, will welcome you, and provide you with some information about the products on offer. You'll then have over 30 minutes to browse and shop. You'll depart from the business at around 9.45am, to head to **Corowa Whisky Distillery & Chocolates**, which is housed in a large disused 1920s flour mill, on the outskirts of the town of Corowa. Upon arrival you'll be given an **Informative Talk** by the owner, Josh, before having the opportunity to sample three of the fine Whiskies distilled on the premises. A range of fine Belgian-style chocolate is also made on the premises, and is for sale in the establishment's retail area. As an added bonus, a large range of products made at the **June Licorice and Chocolate Factory** are also available in the retail area of the complex. After succumbing to temptation, your bags are sure to leave the complex a little heavier than when

you arrived! You'll depart from the complex at around 11.30am, to head to the nearby busy town of **Rutherglen**. This thriving town is located in the centre of Victoria's premier wine-growing region. It has been said that while Rutherglen was founded as a gold rush town, the real wealth existed in the few inches of topsoil, made rich and fertile by the Murray River and Lake Moodemere. For over 160 years winemakers and their families have called Rutherglen home, and vines planted in this special layer of dirt have produced a wide variety of award-winning wines, at both a national and international level. After arriving at around 11.45am, you'll have around two hours to browse, shop, and enjoy lunch in one of the town's coffee shops, cafes bakeries or pubs. You'll have the opportunity to visit shops packed with fashion items, gifts, sweets, books, chocolates, antiques, collectibles, craft, art, and much more! If you would like to purchase some of the fine wine produced in the area, De Bortolis and James & Co have Cellar Doors in the shopping centre. After departing from Rutherford you'll return to the Resort at around 2.30pm. Upon arrival you'll have **Two Options** - to disembark and spend the afternoon relaxing in your room, **or** stay onboard to be conveyed into **Albury City Centre**, where you'll have nearly two hours to hit the shops and explore the centre of this busy city. If you choose to visit the City Centre, you'll depart from the point where you were dropped off at 4.30pm, to return to the Resort. Regardless of which option you choose, at 5.30pm you are to reboard the Coach to head to the **Kinross Woolshed Hotel**, on the outskirts of the city, for a **Full Menu Choices Dinner**, and a great night of **Entertainment!** After arriving at the Woolshed Hotel at around 5.45pm, you'll have time to purchase a drink at the bar, and select where you would like to sit. You will then use the Hotel's extensive menu to select your choices, and then make your way to the ordering point to order your Dinner. The Menu offers a range of Entrees, Burgers (Beef, Vegetarian, Chicken, Lamb), Pasta, Salads, favourites such as a Seafood Basket, Crumbed Lamb Cutlets, Creamy Garlic Prawns, Chicken Parmigiana, House Pot Pie, Confit Duck Maryland, Grilled Vegetable Stack, Steaks (Scotch Fillet, Rump, Wagyu, Porterhouse), Fish (Barramundi, Salmon, Flathead), Vegetarian options, and much more! After completing your Main Course you'll have the opportunity to make your way to the ordering counter to order Dessert! Earlier in the details for this night you will have noticed the word "**Entertainment**". We have organised and are paying for the local **7-Piece "Swag n Billy" Bush Band** to perform throughout the time you are at the venue. The Woolshed Hotel does not usually have live entertainment during the weeknights, so it was up to us to organise and pay for this entertainment. During Dinner background music will play, and then at 7.15pm, the Band will crank up. They'll perform all your favourites, such as Waltzing Matilda, Click Go the Shears, Botany Bay, and many, many other toe-tapping songs to sing along to. During the next two hours you'll also have the opportunity to get up and dance to some organised dances by the Band. You'll depart from the Woolshed Hotel at around 9.30pm, to return to the Resort by around 9.45pm.

### Day 5: Thursday 20 October 2022 – Albury, Culcairn, Gundagai, Jugiong, South Goulburn, Sydney, The Central Coast

Between 6.30am and 8.00am you'll enjoy a **Full Hot & Cold Breakfast** in the Resort's **Cantina Breakfast Room**, before at 8.20am, boarding the coach and saying "goodbye" to the Resort and Albury to head north to the little rural town of **Culcairn**. After arriving at around 9.00am, you'll have time to go for a stroll and to enjoy some refreshments in either the bakery or coffee shop. You'll depart at around 9.45am to head to the town of **Gundagai**. Upon arrival you'll have over an hour to wander around the shopping centre, and to enjoy a refreshment in one of the town's cafes or coffee shops. At around 12.45pm you'll reboard the coach to head to the nearby little village of **Jugiong**. Upon arrival you'll have time to pop into either the historic and fully-resorted "Sir George Hotel", which recently sold for 14 million dollars, or next door to the "Long Track Pantry", which not only houses a wonderful café, but also stocks a wide range of local products, including jams, marmalades, vinegars, sauces, relishes, chutneys, muesli, granola, olives and much more! After departing from Jugiong at around 2.00pm, you'll head straight to the **Yass Service Centre**, where you'll "goodbye" to our Canberra-based passengers, before heading to **Tappers Bakery**, in **South Goulburn** for another rest and refreshment stop. You'll depart at around 4.30pm to head straight to **Uncle Leo's Roadhouse**, in Glenfield, where you'll have the opportunity for a rest stop, before boarding a Feeder Vehicle to be conveyed back to where you joined the tour last Sunday morning. Most Central Coast-based passengers will return to their homes between 9.00pm and 10.30pm.
