#### **ITINERARY**

Day 1: Sunday 22 October 2023 – Canberra & Queanbeyan, Sydney, The Blue Mountains, Lithgow

Inclusions: Entry and 30-Minute Guided Tour at the Norman Lindsay Gallery & Museum, 1-Hour Steam Train Ride on the Zig Zag Railway, Full Choice of the Menu Dinner & 4-Star Accommodation

This morning, between 4.45am and 6.00am, passengers living in Queanbeyan and Canberra will be collected from either outside or close to their homes, before arriving at McDonalds in Lyneham, where they'll board the 5-Star Luxury Coach for their trip away. After departing from Lyneham you'll head to Trapper's Bakery, in South Goulburn, for a rest stop. After departing from Trappers Bakery, you'll head to the outer Sydney suburb of Eastern Creek, where you'll have time to stretch your legs and enjoy a refreshment or two, before reboarding the coach to commence the climb into the Blue Mountains. First stop will be the town of Faulconbridge, where you'll visit the Norman Lindsay Gallery & Museum. Once the home of the well-known Australian artist, Norman Lindsay, this sandstone cottage is now a gallery run by the National Trust. Born in Creswick, Victoria, in 1879, Lindsay went on to become an artist, etcher, sculptor, writer, art critic, novelist, cartoonist and amateur boxer. He was one of the most prolific and popular artists of his generation. Lindsay attracted both acclaim and controversy for his works, many of which infused the Australian landscape with erotic pagan elements, that were deemed by his critics to be "anti-Christian, anti-social and degenerate". The venue contains an impressive display of the artist's watercolours, oils, etchings and ship models. The stunning gardens surrounding the cottage feature a range of beautiful trees, fountains, and a number of Lindsay's sculptures. Upon arrival you'll be taken on a 30-Minute Guided Tour of the Gallery and Museum, before having time to stroll around the Gallery and Garden. You'll depart from this attraction at around 11.45am, to head to the town of **Blackheath**. At a height of 1054 metres above sea level, this busy little tourist town has a real village feel to it. Upon arrival you'll have over an hour to enjoy lunch in one of the town's cafes, coffee shops or pubs, before having time to stroll around the interesting shopping centre. You'll depart from Blackheath at around 1.40pm to head straight to the highly popular Zig Zag Railway, in Clarence, near Lithgow. Opened in 1975, the railway operates using the alignment of the Lithgow Zig Zag line that formed part of the Main Western Line between 1869 and 1910. The line climbs the western flank of the Blue Mountains, using railway zig zags to gain height. The Railway has not operated since 2012, after being plagued by a number of problems. After much of the infrastructure was severely damaged by a bushfire in 2013, and then subsequently again by torrential rain, much of the railway and equipment had to be rebuilt and restored. After years of restoration work, carried out by a team of dedicated and hard-working volunteers, the attraction was to reopen in 2019. However, before it could reopen, the attraction was again severely damaged by a bushfire. This time the COVID-19 pandemic severely delayed its rebuilding and restoration. However, again, a team of dedicated volunteers and helpers devoted thousands of hours to the restoration and rebuilding of the attraction. All this work and effort paid off when the attraction finally reopened on the 27th of May 2023. Upon arrival you'll make your way straight onto the Steam Train, to enjoy a 1-Hour Steam Train Ride from Clarence Station to Bottom Points and back. You'll reboard the coach and depart from the Station at around 4.30pm to head to the Lithgow Workies Club Motel, in the town of Lithgow, where you'll stay for the next three nights. This relatively new 4-Star, 36-Room, award winning Motel, features walk-in showers, modern conveniences and complimentary wi-fi. Located next door to the highly popular Lithgow Workies Club, all the rooms can be accessed without stairs. After having time to relax and freshen up you'll make your way next door to Workies Bistro for a Full Choice of the Menu Dinner. The menu offers a wide range of menu options, including Steaks, Sausages, Rissoles, Schnitzels, Seafood, Roasts, Pasta, Salads, and Desserts.

Day 2: Monday 23 October 2023 – Lithgow, Oberon, Lithgow

Inclusions: Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, Entry to Mayfield Garden, Morning Tea, Lunch, 1-Hour Guided Informative Lithgow Town Tour, Full Choice of the Menu Dinner & 4-Star Accommodation

After enjoying a Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast in the adjacent Workies Bistro, you'll board the coach at around 9.00am to head to Mayfield Garden, on the outskirts of the town of Oberon. Mayfield Garden began taking shape in the mid-1990s and, today, it is one of the largest and most spectacular cool climate gardens in the Southern Hemisphere. Inspired by the grandeur of English country garden estates, the Hawkins family and their garden team have spent many years shaping 65 hectares of the family farm into a stunning garden legacy. Numerous follies and features are blended into the landscape: the breath-taking 80-metre cascade, the walled kitchen garden, the stunning Water Garden, the chapel, the rose garden and much more! Mayfield Garden employs and trains more than 25 locals, full-time, across many trades: including horticulture, stone masonry, green keeping, general labour, machinery operation and more. The Water Garden features ponds, flowing water, waterfalls, a blue-stone bridge, a red bridge, boardwalks, a copper tree fountain, a 13-metre-tall obelisk, a camelia walk, and much more. Mass plantings of azaleas, rhododendrons and hydrangeas mingle with delicate water lilies, tall birch trees, and hundreds of varieties of trees, shrubs, and plants. This garden truly looks its best during Spring! Adjacent to the Water Garden is a Garden Centre containing the Nursery, Shop and Kitchen Café, which all helps to complete the whole experience for visitors to the Garden. Upon arrival, at around 10.00am, you'll sit down to a Morning Tea consisting of either Self-Serve Tea or Coffee, and Freshly-Baked Scones, served with Strawberry or Mixed Berry Jam, and Whipped Cream. After completing your Morning Tea you'll have around 1½ hours to explore the Water Garden, and enjoy the picturesque scenes that this Garden offers. At around 12.15pm you'll be served Lunch, consisting of Self-Serve Tea or Coffee, 11/2 Sandwiches per person (six triangles), and piece of Iced Slice. After having time to visit the shop and garden centre, you'll reboard the coach at around 1.30pm to head to the nearby town of Oberon. Unlike the other towns in the Blue Mountains, Oberon is essentially an agricultural and industrial

town. The area around the town is known for its prime lambs, beef cattle, vegetable production, tree nurseries, nut tree plantations, bulb farms and radiata pine plantations. It is particularly known for its timber mills and logging. At 1113 metres above sea level, the town is known to be very cold in winter, with harsh frosts and snow. Upon arrival you'll have over an hour to explore the shopping centre, and to enjoy a refreshment or two in one of the town's bakeries, coffee shops or cafes. After departing from Oberon at around 2.30pm, you'll head to the **Seven Valleys Information Centre**, in Lithgow. Not only does this Centre provide a wealth of information about Lithgow and the surrounding area, but it also stocks a variety of historical books, and a range of local products such as honey, jams, condiments, chutneys, sauces, handmade soap, candles and other craft items. The Centre also stocks Nutella and Tic Tacs. It is a little-known fact that both these products are made locally, in a nearby factory. Unfortunately, this factory does not allow visitors. You'll have around 40 minutes to browse in the Centre, prior to reboarding the coach. After reboarding the coach a local Tour Guide will take you on a **1-Hour Guided Informative Tour** of Lithgow. The Tour Guide will point out historical buildings, places of interest, and provide you with a wealth of information about the town and its history. The Guided Tour will conclude at around 5.00pm, and you'll return to the Motel at around 5.10pm. After having time to relax and freshen up, you'll make your way next door to **Workies Bistro** for a **Full Choice of the Menu Dinner**. The menu offers a wide range of dining options, including Steaks, Sausages, Rissoles, Schnitzels, Seafood, Roast of the Day, Pasta, Salads, and Desserts.

Day 3: Tuesday 24 October 2023 – Lithgow, Katoomba, Leura, Lithgow

Inclusions: Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, Morning Tea, Entry & Informative Talk at Lithgow Small Arms Factory, Full Choice of the Menu Dinner & 4-Star Accommodation

After making your way into the adjacent **Workies Bistro** for a **Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast**, you'll board the coach at around 8.45am to head to **The Lolly Bug**, at Little Hartley, located between Lithgow and Blackheath. This fascinating shop stocks over 2000 lines of confectionary from around the world, including old fashioned English sweets, temptations from New Zealand, America, Scotland and the Netherlands, as well as a range of good old Aussie favourites. You're sure to be tempted by products such as Jelly Belly, Rock Candy, Chocolate Coated delights, Sugar and Gluten Free Iollies, novelty items, Iollipops, and much more! After accommodating your sugar fix for the next six months, you'll depart from the shop at around 10.00am to head to **Scenic World** – one of the premier tourist attractions in the Blue Mountains. Established in 1945, this family-owned business is the home of the world-renowned **Scenic Railway** – the world's steepest railway, **The Cableway** - the Southern Hemisphere's steepest aerial cable car, the famous **Beyond Skyway** – a cable car that runs from one side of the Jamison Valley to the other, which offers some of the most breathtaking views in Australia, and hundreds of metres of elevated rainforest boardwalks. Upon arrival you'll be served a delicious **Morning Tea**, consisting of freshly-brewed Tea and Coffee, Finger Sandwiches, Danish Pastries and Chopped Fruit. After completing your Morning Tea, and having time to browse in the adjacent Gift Shop, you'll have two (2) options to fill in the next couple of hours:

Option No.1 — Experience the 'Ultimate Discovery Pass' — a ride on the Scenic Railway, the Cableway and the Beyond Skyway. You'll have nearly two hours to enjoy these three rides prior to reboarding the coach at 1.25pm. The cost of this option is not included in the cost of this tour. The normal cost for this experience is \$54.00 per adult, however, we have obtained a special Group Booking Rate of \$42.90 per adult. If you choose this option, you must advise us of your decision when you book for this tour. We'll require payment for this amount when you forward us your final payment for this tour.

<u>Option No.2</u> – Following Morning Tea, you'll reboard the coach to be conveyed to Katoomba Shopping Centre, where you'll have around 90 minutes to stroll and browse in some of the town's interesting shops. At the completion of your visit, you'll reboard the coach at around 1.10pm to return to Scenic World to collect the passengers who chose Option No.1.

After departing from Scenic World at 1.25pm, with everyone back on board, you'll head to the picturesque town of Leura. Upon arrival you'll have around 90 minutes to stroll in the town's elegant Shopping Centre. Not only does the town contain many coffee shops, cafes and tea rooms, but it is also home to a range of interesting antique shops, art galleries, craft shops, fashion boutiques, bookshops, and more! Be sure to pop into Josophan's award-winning chocolate shop! You're sure to be tempted! You'll depart from Leura at around 3.10pm to head to the Lithgow Small Arms Factory. Upon arrival you'll be given an Informative Talk about the history of the Small Arms Factory, and its current exhibits. You'll then have time to wander around the Museum. Any questions you have will be answered by a number of volunteers, who will be in attendance during your visit. In 1906 the Australian Government resolved that Australia should be independent as far as possible for her own defence, and to ease reliance on the British for the supply of defence materials. The Lithgow Small Arms Factory commenced production in 1912. This Museum, situated in the grounds of the Small Arms Factory, celebrates the rich history of Australia's first high precision mass production facility and its people, and houses a large collection of military and civilian firearms that were manufactured at the factory and elsewhere. The Museum also houses a range of non-military items manufactured in the Factory during its 80 years of precision engineering, including sewing machines, hand cuffs, and many other commercial items. In the 1930s the floundering Australian wool Industry was saved when the Factory manufactured shearing handset parts, eliminating the need to import expensive British equipment. In 2019 the Museum was placed on the UNESCO Australian Memory of the World Register, which lists influential collections and documents considered key to Australia's history. The Museum experiences around 9,000 annual visitors, and is a big drawcard to the town. You'll depart from the Museum at around 4.45pm to return to the Motel. After having time to relax and freshen up, you'll make your way next door to Workies Bistro for a Full Choice of the Menu Dinner. The menu offers a wide range of dining options, including Steaks, Sausages, Rissoles, Schnitzels, Seafood, Roast of the Day, Pasta, Salads, and Desserts.

Day 4: Wednesday 25 October 2023 – Lithgow, Bilpin, Windsor, Ebenezer, Sydney, Canberra & Queanbeyan Inclusions: Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, Wine-Tasting, Afternoon Tea

After making your way into the adjacent **Workies Bistro** for a **Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast**, you'll board the coach at around 9.00am, bid the Motel and Lithgow 'goodbye', and head to the **Bilpin Fruit Bowl**. This popular café, retail outlet and orchard is a 'must visit' for anyone travelling on the Bells Line of Road. Owned by Simon & Margaret Tadrosse since 1985, the business is now managed by their four children and their families. The retail outlet not only stocks a range of fruit in season, but also jam, cider, candles, pottery,

jam, apple juice and much more! The café is known for its fabulous apple pies, meat pies, cakes, slices, scones and more! You'll have around an hour to browse and enjoy a refreshment or two, prior to reboarding the coach at around 11.00am to head to the town of Windsor. You'll be dropped-off close to Windsor Mall, which is pedestrian zone lined with interesting shops, boutiques, and eating establishments. If you're shopped out, why not pop into the nearby Hawkesbury Regional Museum? Located in Baker Street, near the northern end of Windsor Mall, the Museum explores the social history of the Hawkesbury Region, and includes a number of semipermanent displays and exhibitions, based around the central themes of 'Land, River, People', with objects drawn from the collection of the Hawkesbury Historical Society. Collection highlights include the celestial globe that belonged to John Tebbutt, an internationallyrenowned astronomer, who lived his whole life in the Hawkesbury; the diary kept by a member of HMAS Hawkesbury during World War II, which features a record of the Japanese surrender, and the uniquely Hawkesbury legend and creation, the Flabbit! The Flabbit, a taxidermy specimen of a 'flying rabbit', was created by one of the local Councillors in response to Watkin Tench's mention of the fanciful animals in his 1780s diaries. The flabbit, made in the 1980s, attracts visitors from far and wide, and the exhibit enjoys an infamous reputation. After having over an hour to have lunch in one of the town's many eating establishments, and to explore the town centre, you'll reboard the coach at around 1.00pm to head to Tizzana Winery, near the historic village of Ebenezer. Set in picturesque and peaceful surroundings close to the Hawkesbury River, you would never know that the huge city of Sydney is literally only a few kilometres away. Upon arrival you'll be given an Informative Talk and Wine-Tasting by the owners, Peter & Carolyn Auld, and their son Jonathan. You'll have the opportunity to sample a number of the varieties produced on the premises, including Shiraz, Sémillon, Merlot, Tannat, Petit Vergot, and more! The Cellar Door not only stocks a range of Tizzana Wines, but also a small range of locallymade products, such as Jams, Jellies and Marmalades. Following your wine-tasting, you'll enjoy a delicious home-style Afternoon Tea, consisting of Tea or Coffee, and a slice of Carolyn's home-made lced Carrot Cake or Orange Syrup Cake. After completing your Afternoon Tea, you'll reboard the coach at around 2.45pm to head to the Lindt Chocolate Factory Outlet, at Marsden Park. This amazing factory outlet sells over 25 flavours of chocolate, including dark, milk, white, cappuccino, strawberries and cream, blood orange, salted caramel, and many more! For much of the year many of the chocolates are sold at up to 50% off the normal retail price, including the 'Pick & Mix' range. Some of these packs would make a great Christmas present! You're sure to be tempted! You'll depart from the Factory Outlet at around 4.10pm to head to the Roadhaven Café at Eastern Creek, where you'll have a 30-minute rest stop. After reboarding the coach at around 5.00pm, you'll head south, towards Canberra. After having another quick rest stop in Marulan at around 6.30pm, you'll arrive in Lyneham at around 8.30pm. It is at this point that you'll board the Feeder Vehicle to be conveyed back to your home. You'll arrive home between 9.00pm and 10.00pm.
