ITINERARY

Day 1: Sunday 2 November 2025 – The Central Coast, Blackheath, Raglan, Stuart Town, Dubbo

Inclusions: *Two-Course Alternate-Drop Dinner, 4.5-Star Accommodation*

This morning, between 6.30am and 8.00am, you'll be collected from either outside or close to your home (this service will be available to most people living east of the Pacific Highway between Lake Munmorah and Kariong), and head to **Eastern Creek**, where you'll have time to stretch your legs and enjoy a refreshment or two, before boarding the **5-Star Luxury Coach** for your trip away. After departing from Eastern Creek, you'll commence the climb into the **Blue Mountains**. The first stop, at around 11.15am, will be the town **Blackheath**. Upon arrival, you'll have around 90 minutes to browse in the interesting shops in the town centre, and to enjoy lunch in one of the town's cafes or pubs. The New Ivanhoe Hotel reputedly offers a delicious Sunday Roast! You'll depart from Blackheath at around 12.45pm, to head to the **Wild Bean Café**, in **Raglan**, on the outskirts of Bathurst. Upon arrival, you'll have time to stretch your legs and grab a refreshment or two. After departing from Raglan, you'll head towards the city of Orange, where you'll bypass the city centre, and then turn onto Burrendong Way, to head towards Dubbo. This route offers lovely views of rich farmland, and will take you through the tiny hamlets of Mullion Creek, Euchareena, and Stuart Town. Upon arrival in **Stuart Town** at around 4.10pm, you'll have the opportunity for a quick rest stop and to briefly stretch your legs, before reboarding the coach at around 4.30pm, to head straight to the busy Central Western NSW city of **Dubbo**. After reaching Dubbo at around 5.45pm, you'll arrive at the **Cattleman's Country Motor Inn**, where you'll stay for the next four nights. This large accommodation venue, situated on three acres, boasts 170 rooms, an award-winning restaurant, conference and function facilities, an indoor heated swimming pool, and two outdoor swimming pools. After disembarking from the coach, you won't have to touch your luggage. It will be delivered to your room by one of the Motor Inn's porters. Your ground floor or lift-accessible room, complete with walk-in shower, will be located reasonably close to the complex's Reception and Restaurant, meaning that you won't have to walk a long distance to these facilities, or to and from the coach. After having time to unpack and freshen up, you'll make your way into the **Cattleman's Restaurant** at around 6.15pm, where you can purchase a drink at the bar, prior to sitting down by 6.45pm to a delicious **Two-Course Alternate-Drop Dinner**. For Main Course, you'll be served either Roast Lamb or Roast Beef, with Baked Potatoes, Baked Pumpkin, Cauliflower Cheese, Steamed Peas and Gravy. The Vegetarian option will be Fettuccine Puttanesca - Sauteed Onion, Garlic, and a dash of Chili, in a rich Tomato Sauce, with Capers, Kalamata Olives, Capsicum, Baby Spinach and Shaved Parmesan. If you'd prefer to be served the Vegetarian option, you'll need to notify us about 10 days prior to the departure date of the tour. For Dessert, you'll be served either Pavlova with Berries, a Berry Coulis, and Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Sticky Date Pudding, with Butterscotch Sauce and Vanilla Ice-Cream.

Day 2: Monday 3 November 2025 – Dubbo, Narromine, Trangie, Warren, Gilgandra, Dubbo

Inclusions: *Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, Two-Course Alternate-Drop Dinner, 4.5-Star Accommodation*

This morning, between 6.30am and 8.15am, you'll enjoy a **Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast** in the **Cattleman's Restaurant**, prior to boarding the coach at 8.30am, to head to the town of **Narromine**. Located on the Macquarie River, about 40kms west of Dubbo, this busy rural town, with a population of around 3500 residents, is surrounded by rich farmland, producing sheep, cattle, wool and cereal crops. In recent years, cotton production has become another important industry in the area. The cricketering great, Glenn McGrath, was born in Narromine. A life-size bronze statue of Glenn can be found in the town's Tom Perry Park. Upon arrival, you'll have nearly an hour to explore the town centre, before reboarding the coach to head to the little town of **Trangie**. Located about 34 kilometres west of Narromine, with a population of around 1000 residents, this quaint little town is home to some of the most authentic country pubs, dating back to the late 1800s. In recent times, cotton has become one of the main crops in the area, and the town now has its own cotton gin. You'll have around 45 minutes to stroll around the town centre, and maybe grab a refreshment or two along the way. At around 11.45am, you'll depart from Trangie, and head to the larger town of **Warren**. Located on the Macquarie River, with a population of around 2,200 residents, farmland surrounding the town is dominated by sheep and cotton. In fact, the shire council refers to itself as the 'Wool and Cotton Capital'. Merino sheep have long been bred locally, and in recent years, a cotton gin has been built close to the town. Other local produce grown in the area includes wheat, oats, sorghum and maize. The town is home to several heritage buildings, including the Anglican, Presbyterian and Catholic Churches, the Club House Hotel, the Royal Hotel, and the Courthouse. Upon arrival, you'll have time to enjoy lunch in one of the town's cafes or pubs, and stroll through the busy shopping centre. You'll depart from Warren at around 12.45pm, to head a couple of blocks away to view the **Mural** on the town's water tower. You'll have time to disembark and take a photo or two, prior to reboarding the coach to head to the town of **Gilgandra**. Located on the banks of the Castlereagh River, at the junction of the Oxley, Castlereagh and Newell Highways, the town has a population of around 4300 residents. It is best-known for initiating the Coo-ee March on the 10th of October 1915. The prolonged coo-ee is usually used in the bush to attract attention. The March left Gilgandra with a group of 35 men, and headed for Sydney on the first recruiting march of World War I. The marchers called 'Coo-ee' at each town they passed through along the way, to attract men to join the March. By the time it reached Sydney on the 12th of November, over 260 recruits had joined. Like the other towns in the region, Gilgandra is surrounded by rich fertile farmland, that produces grain, sheep and cattle. Upon arrival, you'll have time to stroll around the busy shopping centre, and maybe make a purchase or two in some of the town's interesting shops and boutiques. At around 4.10pm, you'll head to the nearby **Coo-ee Heritage and Visitor Information Centre**. The Centre houses not only a range of local products, but also a range of significant artefacts from the March, including the flag carried by the marchers, and a photographic display, which gives the viewer a moving insight into the marchers' lives. You'll depart from the Centre at around 4.45pm, to return to Dubbo, and the Cattleman's Country Motor Inn. After having time to relax and freshen up, you'll make your way to the Motor Inn's **Cattleman's Restaurant** by 6.00pm, to purchase a drink from the bar, prior to sitting down to a delicious **Two-Course Alternate-Drop Dinner** at 6.30pm. For Main Course you'll be served either Lamb Shanks in Red Wine, Garlic and Rosemary, served with Creamy Potato Mash, Season Vegetables and a Rosemary Jus, or Atlantic Salmon, resting on Roasted Chat Potatoes, Seasonal Greens and a Dill & Caper Hollandaise Sauce. The Vegetarian option will be Creamy Mushroom Risotto, with sauteed Onions, Garlic, Mushrooms and Arborio Rice, with a splash of Cream, and Baby Spinach. If you'd prefer to be served the Vegetarian option, you'll need to notify us about 10 days prior to the departure date of the tour. For Dessert, you'll be served either Vanilla Bean Crème Brûlée or Banana & Caramel Tart, with Ice-Cream.

Day 3: Tuesday 4 November 2025 – Dubbo, Dunedoo, Gulgong, Wellington, Dubbo

Inclusions: *Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, 35-Minute Guided Informative Tour of Gulgong, Entry to the Gulgong Pioneer Museum, Entry to the Holtermann Museum, Entry to the Henry Lawson Centre, Pre-Dinner Drink, Full Choice of the Menu Dinner, 4.5-Star Accommodation*

This morning, between 6.45am and 8.15am, you'll enjoy a **Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast** in the Motor Inn's **Cattleman's Restaurant**, prior to boarding the coach to head to the town of **Dunedoo**. Situated within the Warrumbungle Shire, with a population of around 1000 residents, this picturesque little town is known for its long main street, its impressive Silo Art display, and for its heritage pubs and arts and craft shops. The town is a service centre for the surrounding agricultural district, which has a strong focus on wheat, cattle, and mixed farming. Upon arrival, you'll have around one hour to explore the town, view the **Silo Art**, which is close to where the coach will park, and enjoy a refreshment or two in the town's bakery or café. Side one and side two of the Silos were painted by Peter Mortimore during July, August and September 2020. Depicted on one side is Winx, the retired champion Australian racehorse, and her famous rider, Hugh Bowman, who was born in Dunedoo. The artwork also features Chris Waller, Winx's trainer. The third side of the Silo features a huge mural by artists Daniel Krause and Jarad Danby. This artwork was completed in June 2021, and depicts the likeness of Daniel's own son reading a book in a wheat field. After taking in the sights in the town, you'll reboard the coach and head to the historic town of **Gulgong**. With a current population of around 2,700 residents, this former goldmining town, with its narrow winding streets, is lined with a number of stunning heritage-listed buildings. Many of these buildings are still adorned with wide verandahs and iron lacework. These buildings have hardly changed since the 1800s, hence the reason why the town has been deemed one of Australia's national treasures. Gold fever struck the region in 1870, when payable gold was found at nearby Red Hill. This discovery attracted over 20,000 people to the area, in search of gold. You'll learn about the story of this goldrush during your included visit to the **Gulgong Pioneers Museum**. Established in 1962, this Museum is home to one of the finest collections of Australiana in the country. Located in the old Times Bakery and Produce Store, in the heart of the town, the award-winning museum's collection includes a comprehensive array of domestic tools and utensils, farming and mining equipment, horse-drawn vehicles, early photographs, Aboriginal and geological artefacts, periodic clothing, and buildings dating from Gulgong's heyday during the turbulent Gold Rush days. The Museum has copies of the Holtermann collection of historical photographs, and houses a fully restored Cobb and Co. coach, along with other horse-drawn vehicles. During your time in the town, be sure to make your way to the **Gulgong Holtermann Museum**. This contemporary Museum is housed in two beautifully restored 1870s Gulgong gold rush buildings. These two buildings, along with many others, were photographed in 1872, and are now part of the Holtermann Collection of photographs which are United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) listed. During your visit to the Museum, you'll be introduced to the fascinating world of wet plate photography. Imagine the process of capturing a moment in time on a glass plate coated with light-sensitive chemicals. Each photograph is a precious artifact, preserving a slice of history for future generations. The Museum's well-informed team of volunteers will be available to direct you through the Museum to explore this interesting era with the use of touchscreens, interactive activities, or a narrated street trail. Entry to this Museum is also included in your visit to the town. Gulgong was the childhood home of the highly regarded bush poet, Henry Lawson, and where the great Dame Nellie Melba once performed in the town's Prince of Wales Opera House. During your visit to the town, you'll have the included option of visiting the **Henry Lawson Centre**. During your visit to the Centre, you'll learn about Lawson's life and cultural legacy, and view the remnants of his childhood home. Upon arrival in Gulgong, at around 11.30am, a local historian will board the coach to take you on a **35-Minute Guided Informative Tour** of the town. The guide will provide you with a short history of the town, and point out a number of points of historical interest along the way. At the conclusion of the Guided Tour, you'll arrive in the Town's centre, where you'll have over two hours to enjoy lunch in one of the town's many eating establishments, and to visit the three Museums listed above. You'll depart from Gulgong at around 3.00pm, to head to the town of **Wellington**. Located on the Mitchell Highway, about 100 kilometres north of Orange, this town has a population of around 4000 residents. Nestled in the foothills of the Mount Arthur Reserve, where the Bell and Macquarie Rivers meet, the area surrounding the town is best-known for its rich agricultural land, that produces vegetables, wheat, wool, lambs and beef cattle. Upon arrival, you'll have around 45 minutes to stroll around the shopping centre, and take in the atmosphere of this busy town. At around 4.30pm, you'll depart from Wellington to head straight to **Club Dubbo**, where you'll enjoy an included **Full Choice of the Menu Dinner**, in the Club's **Riverview Bistro**. After arriving at the Club, you'll make your way to the Bar, where you'll enjoy an included **Pre-Dinner Drink**. You'll then make your way up to the ordering point, to order whatever you want from the menu, before returning to your table to wait for your meal to be prepared. At the completion of your Entrée and/or Main Course, you're welcome to make your way to the Coffee Shop, to order your included Dessert. You'll depart from the Club at around 7.30pm, and return to the Motor Inn a couple of minutes later.

Day 4: Wednesday 5 November 2025 – Dubbo Zoo, Dubbo City Centre

Inclusions: *Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, Entry & 2.5-Hour Guided Tour of Taronga Western Plains Zoo, Morning Tea, Two-Course Alternate-Drop Dinner, 4.5-Star Accommodation*

This morning, between 6.45am and 8.15am, you'll enjoy a **Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast** in the Motor Inn's **Cattleman's Restaurant**, prior to boarding the coach to head to the nearby **Taronga Western Plains Zoo**. This popular Zoo is home to over 1000 animals, including exotic and endangered species such as the African Lion, Cheetah, Giraffe, White Rhinoceros, African Wild Dog, Black Rhinoceros, Meerkat, Zebra, Ring-Tailed Lemur, Eastern Bongo, Sumatran Tiger, Asian Elephant, Takhi, Greater One-Horned Rhinoceros, and many more! Most of these animals roam in the Zoo's wide-open spaces across the 300 hectares of bushland. After arriving at the Zoo, a Tour Guide will board the coach, to take you on a **2.5-Hour Guided Tour** of the Zoo. During the six-kilometre-long circuit, the coach will stop several times to allow you to visit many of the enclosures. At around 10.00am, the coach will stop at the **Waterhole Café** for around 30 minutes, for you to enjoy an included **Morning Tea**. The Café serves a range of hot and cold drinks, as well as a range of cakes and other temptations. At around 10.30am, you'll reboard the coach to continue the Guided Tour. At the completion of the Tour, you'll have around 45 minutes to visit the Zoo's incredible Gift Shop, as well as to visit some of the nearby animal enclosures. After departing from the Zoo at around 12.30pm, you'll head into **Dubbo City Centre**. The vibrant city of Dubbo, with a population of around 57,000 residents, is located in the heart of the beautiful Macquarie Valley, on the banks of the majestic Macquarie River. The City has a rich history, starting with its Aboriginal inhabitants, the Wiradjuri people, who lived in the area for over 40,000 years. European settlement began with explorer John Oxley's visit in 1818, followed by the establishment of Dubbo Station by Robert Dullhunty in the early 1830s. The town was officially proclaimed a village in 1849, became a municipality in 1872, and was declared a city in 1966. One of the city's key historical landmarks is the Old Dubbo Gaol, a State Heritage listed site, that opened in 1874. It operated as a goal until it closed in 1966. Located at the northern end of the City's shopping centre, today it operates as a popular tourist attraction. The Gaol will be open during your visit, and the entry cost is around \$20.00 per person. As the City grew, it became a major regional centre, known for its agricultural production, and as an important transportation hub. Today, farmland surrounding the city produces a range of products such as wheat, wool and timber. Upon arrival in the City Centre, you'll have around two hours to browse the shops, and enjoy lunch in one of the city's cafes, coffee shops, bakeries or pubs. You'll depart from Dubbo City Centre at around 2.45pm to head to the nearby **Dubbo Visitor Information Centre**. This impressive Centre not only stocks a comprehensive range of tourism-related brochures and booklets, but also a wide variety of products such as jams, relish, olive oil, honey, sauces, jerky, dressings, biscuits, rocky road, chocolate, tea shirts, aprons, tea towels, mugs, market bags, hats, and much more! After browsing in the Centre, you'll reboard the coach at around 3.30pm,

to be taken on an informative **60-Minute Guided City Tour**, by a local Tour Guide. The Guide will not only provide you with a short history of the City, but also point out a number of significant historical buildings and points of interest along the way. At the completion of the Tour, at around 4.30pm, you'll return to the Motor Inn, where you'll have time to relax and freshen up, prior to making your way into the Motor Inn's **Cattleman's Restaurant** by 5.30pm, to purchase a drink at the bar, prior to sitting down to a delicious **Two-Course Alternate-Drop Dinner** at 6.00pm. For Main Course you'll be served either Crumbed Pork Loin – Parmesan & Parsley Crumbed Pork Loin, served with Baked Potato, Baked Sweet Potato, Steamed Greens, and a Creamy Honey Mustard Sauce or Barramundi, served with Baked Potato, Baked Sweet Potato, Steamed Greens, and a Dill & Lemon Beurre Blanc Sauce. The Vegetarian option will be Mediterranean Salad - Roast Capsicum, Mushroom, Eggplant, Olives, Cherry Tomatoes, served with Baba Ghanoush and an Olive Oil Dressing. If you'd prefer to be served the Vegetarian option, you'll need to notify us about 10 days prior to the departure date of the tour. For Dessert, you'll be served either Cattleman's Brownie, with Pistachio Praline, Strawberry Coulis and Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Plain Cheesecake, served with Berries, a Berry Coulis, and Vanilla Ice-Cream.

Day 5: Thursday 6 November 2025 – Dubbo, Molong, Bathurst, Leura, The Central Coast

Inclusions: Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, High Tea

This morning, between 6.30am and 7.30am, you'll enjoy a **Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast** in the Motor Inn's **Cattleman's Restaurant**, prior to departing from the Motor Inn and Dubbo at around 8.00am to head to the town of **Molong**. This small historic rural town, tucked into the rolling green hills of the Macquarie Ranges, is located on the Mitchell Highway, about 35 kilometres north-west of Orange. Surrounded by orchards, vineyards and rich agricultural farmland, the countryside surrounding the town is known as Australia's 'food basket'. With a population of around 1,600 residents, the town's heritage-listed main street is lined with grand colonial buildings, which today house several interesting boutiques and galleries. Upon arrival, you'll have around one hour to explore the town centre, and to enjoy a refreshment or two in one of the town's bakeries, cafes or coffee shops. After departing from Molong at around 10.30am, you'll head straight to the city of **Bathurst**. Located on the banks of the Macquarie River, this thriving city, with a population of around 45,000 residents, is Australia's oldest inland colonial settlement. Today the city is best-known for its surrounding rich agricultural farmland, vineyards, food manufacturing and education facilities, tourism venues, such as Mount Panorama Racing Circuit, and much more! Upon arrival at around 11.45am, you'll have around 90 minutes to explore the city centre, and to enjoy a snack in one of the city's many eating establishments. Be sure not to eat too much, as at your next stop, you are going to sit down to a wonderful and generous-size afternoon tea! After departing from Bathurst at around 1.05pm, you'll head straight to the luxurious **Fairmont Resort**, located close to the town of **Leura**, in the beautiful Blue Mountains. This beautiful resort, perched high on the escarpment of the World Heritage listed Jamison Valley, offers stunning views over the Valley and National Park. Upon arrival, you'll sit down to a delicious included **High Tea**. You'll be offered a selection of Fine Tea and Coffee varieties, Hot Chocolate, 4 x Finger Sandwiches per person, 1 x Fruit Scone and 1 x Plain Scone with Jam and freshly-whipped Cream per person, and 3 x Small Cakes per person. If you feel in the mood, for a few dollars, you're welcome to purchase a glass of bubbles, to have with your High Tea. You'll have around 90 minutes to leisurely enjoy the experience, and to take in the atmosphere and ambience of this beautiful hotel and its surroundings. You'll depart from here at around 4.15pm, to head down the Blue Mountains, back to the **Roadhaven Café/BP Petrol Station** complex in **Eastern Creek**. After a short rest stop, you'll board one of the waiting luxury Feeder Vehicles to be conveyed back to the point where you joined the tour last Sunday morning. Most Central Coast-based residents are expected to return to their homes between 7.15pm and 9.00pm.
