ITINERARY

Day 1: Sunday 23 April 2023 – Queanbeyan, Canberra, Yass, Wagga Wagga Inclusions: Two-Course Generous-Serve Alternate Drop Dinner & 4.5-Star Accommodation

This morning, between 10.30am and 12.00pm, you'll be collected from either outside or close to your home (this service will be available to most people living in Canberra, Queanbeyan and Yass), and head to Yass Town Centre. Upon arrival you'll have time to stroll around and explore the shopping centre of this busy rural town. Most shops will be open, so be prepared for some serious browsing. The town has a number of cafes, bakeries, coffee shops and pubs, so finding somewhere to have lunch won't be a problem. It is at this point that our Canberra-based passengers will join the tour. After having around 90 minutes in the town, you'll depart at around 3.00pm to head straight to Wagga Wagga. After reaching Wagga Wagga at around 5.00pm, you'll arrive at the stylish 4-5-star Mercure Wagga Wagga Hotel. This 86-room Hotel will be your home for the next three nights. After having time to unpack and freshen up, you'll make your way into the Hotel's One Morgan Street Restaurant, where you'll sit down to a Two-Course Alternate-Drop Dinner. For Main Course you'll be served either Roast Lamb with Baked Potatoes, Baked Pumpkin, Cauliflower Cheese, Steamed Peas, Carrots and Gravy, or Roast Beef with Baked Potatoes, Baked Pumpkin, Cauliflower Cheese, Steamed Peas, Carrots and Gravy. The Vegetarian option will be Spinach & Ricotta Ravioli with Pesto Cream & Candied Tomatoes. For Dessert you'll be served either an Individual Meringue with Mixed Berries, a Berry Coulis and Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Plain Cheesecake with Berries, a Berry Coulis and Vanilla Ice-Cream. Tea & Coffee will then be served.

Day 2: Monday 24 April 2023 – Wagga Wagga, Coolamon, Lockhart, Wagga Wagga

Inclusions: Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, 30-Minute Guided Informative Coolamon Town Tour, Entry to the Coolamon Fire Museum, Entry to the Coolamon Up to Date Store, 30-Minute Guided Informative Lockhart Town Tour, Entry & Informative Talk at

Lockhart's Greens Gunyah Museum, Two-Course Pre-Ordered Dinner & 4.5-Star Accommodation

Between 6.30am and 8.00am you'll enjoy a Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast in the Hotel's Restaurant, prior to boarding the coach at around 8.20am, to head to the little town of Coolamon. This pretty little town features charming pubs, shops and buildings with wide wrought-iron verandahs and awnings, manicured gardens, and interesting heritage buildings. This area was originally populated by the Wiradjure Tribe, prior to the arrival of Europeans in 1848. In the years that followed, the town was established, and the Post Office and Railway Station opened in May 1881. Located in the wheat belt of New South Wales, the town is surrounded by rich farmland, that produces some of the best wheat, chaff, and fat lambs in the region. Upon arrival, the town's Mayor, David McCann, will board the coach, and take you on a 30-Minute Guided Informative Tour of the town, prior to having over 90 minutes to explore and browse in the little town centre. During your stroll in the shopping centre, be sure to visit the Coolamon Fire Museum. This Museum was opened in 2015, and features a fascinating display of fire-related artefacts – brass helmets, old breathing apparatus, fire-fighting equipment, uniforms, and much more! Make sure you also visit the Up-to-Date Store. Between 1909 and 1932 a general store operated in this building, before the store moved elsewhere in the shopping centre. In the years that followed it was used as a storage area and workshop, and then a second-hand and antiques store. In 1996, the Coolamon Shire Council purchased the building, and it was turned into a museum and cultural facility. The store boasts its original fittings, including the Lamson Cash Railway, which is the only known Ball-Style Cash Railway System in the world, that is still in its original location. The Ball Style Cash Railway is the predecessor to the later models of cash carriers, including the spring loaded 'flying fox' and the pneumatic systems that can still be found in some old department stores, today. The building's interior features vaulted wood-lined ceilings, sturdy wooden counters, shelves and benches, and the floors bear the physical imprint of the many thousands of customers and staff that moved through the store over the years. The building also houses a cellar, that was originally used to store cheese, eggs, ham and fish. It is amazing to hear that fresh seafood was available for sale nearly 120 years ago in this store. The building also houses 'The Mavis Furner Collection'. This exquisite collection of over 200 garments and accessories, showcases the life and experience of former well-known local, Mavis Furner, and her work in the community. All the garments were designed, made, and worn by Mavis over a 40-year period. It all began when Mavis and her husband, George, went to Manly for a holiday in 1959, and Mavis saw an expensive Italian hand crocheted coat in the window of a boutique. She really wanted the coat but....the price! So Mavis decided that as she could crochet a doyley, she could probably crochet a coat. When she returned home she purchased some wool and began creating. Before departing from the town, also be sure to call into the Coolamon Cheese Shop & Café. The shop stocks a range of artisan cheeses made on the premises, including the 'D'Brie' - a double brie - 'The Rock' - blue vein, and 'Belle Isle' - a soft blue cheese. The cheesemakers also make a range of cheeses made from ingredients sourced from indigenous producers. The shop also stocks a wide range of jams, jellies, spreads, pickles, relishes, sauces, dressings, olive oil and more! You'll depart from Coolamon at around 11.15am, and head to the small rural town of Lockhart. This town is also known for its wide main street, its verandahs, and the birthplace of the late Tim Fisher, the leader of the National Party between 1990 and 1999, and Deputy Prime Minister between 1996 and 1999. The town was originally known as Greens Gunyah, but in 1898, it was renamed Lockhart, in honour of C G N Lockhart, the commissioner for Crown Lands in the Murrumbidgee River Area during the 1850s. First stop in the town will be CWA Park, to view the Lockhart Water Tower Mural. This impressive artwork, by artists Scott Nagy and Janne Birkner, took nearly three weeks to complete. After applying an undercoat, they painted it freehand, using spray cans. The very vibrant mural depicts a flowing waterfall and some of Australia's most iconic birds and wildlife. After having time to stroll around the tower, take a photo or ten, you'll have around 90 minutes to stroll to the nearby town centre, have

lunch in one of the town's eating establishments, and take in the atmosphere. After reboarding the coach at around 2.15pm, you'll be taken on a 30-Minute Guided Informative Tour of the town by one of the town's well-known historians, prior to arriving at Greens Gunyah Museum, close to the centre of the town. This Museum houses a large display of fascinating historical artefacts, photography and machinery. It also houses the 'Doris Golder Wool Art Gallery' - an amazing collection of layered 'Wool Art' featuring portraits of notable and well-known Australians, landscapes and animals, all created by using natural coloured fleece wool. The Museum also houses the 'Tim Fisher Exhibition'. This Exhibition was opened by Tim in May 2019, not long before his death in August 2019. All the items were donated by Tim to the Museum, including paintings of trains, a copy of the books he wrote, his famous hats, along with his collection of mobile phones that he used while he was in Parliament. Five story boards tell of his early life in Boree Creek, his time in state and federal parliament, and his life after politics. You'll depart from the Museum at around 3.30pm, and head to the tiny hamlet of Milbrulong, to view the Milbrulong Water Tower Mural. This striking mural, featuring the vibrant colours of the Australian Rosella, is yet another example of the work of artists, Scott Nagy and Janne Birkner. Once again, you'll have time to disembark from the coach to take in the scene, grab a few photos, prior to reboarding at around 4.15pm, to return to Wagga Wagga and the Hotel. After returning to the Hotel at around 5.00pm, you'll have time to relax, before making your way into the Hotel's One Morgan Street Restaurant, where you'll sit down to a Two-Course Pre-Ordered Dinner. For Main Course you'll have the choice of either Prosciutto-Wrapped Chicken Breast, stuffed with Sun-dried Tomato and Mozzarella, served on a Sweet Potato Mash, with Broccolini, and a Creamy Pesto Sauce, or slow-braised Lamb Shank, served on a Sweet Potato Mash, with Broccolini and Gravy, or Pan-Fried Barramundi, served with Herb-Crushed Potatoes, Steamed Greens, and a Burnt Butter Sauce. For Dessert, you'll have the choice of either Sticky Date Pudding, served with a Butterscotch Sauce and Vanilla Bean Ice-Cream, or Lime & Lemon Tart, served with King Island Double Cream, or freshly-chopped Fruit Salad & Vanilla Ice-Cream. Self-Serve Tea & Coffee will then be available.

Day 3: Anzac Day - Tuesday 25 April 2023 – Wagga Wagga

Inclusions: Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, Informative Talk, Guided Tour and Wine, Cider & Beer Tasting at Borambola Wines, Two-Course Pre-Ordered Dinner & 4.5-Star Accommodation

Being a public holiday, today, your Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast will be served a little later - between 7.00am and 9.30am. With it being Anzac Day, you'll be given the opportunity to attend either the annual Anzac Day Dawn Service, that is held in Wagga Wagga's Victory Memorial Gardens at 5.30am, or the Anzac Day March, that is held in the main street between 10.30am and 11.00am. Due to the close proximity to defence force bases in the area, a sizeable component of these commemorations are made up of defence force personnel, which helps to add to the pomp and atmosphere of these occasions. At the time of this brochure going to print, the local RSL Sub Branch had not announced the arrangements for these commemorations. Consequently, when you receive your final receipt for this tour, you'll be notified about which of these commemorative events will be offered to the passengers. This morning you'll also visit the Wagga Wagga Botanic Gardens. Located only a short distance away from the Hotel, you'll spend around an hour in the Gardens, where you'll have the opportunity to stroll along the pathways and enjoy the relaxed atmosphere. You'll be able to view various garden areas that showcase camellias, cacti, succulents, proteas, roses, Australian natives, and much more! Be sure to view the Chinese theme garden, complete with pavilion, pond and bridge. Following the Anzac Day commemorations, the City's shops will open at midday. At around this time you'll be conveyed to Wagga Wagga City Centre, where you'll have around two hours to stroll, browse, and enjoy lunch in one of the City's many eating establishments. The Shopping Centre stretches for four blocks, and comprises not only dozens of regular shops, but also large shops and department stores such as Myer, Big W, Kmart, Best & Less, Rivers, JB HiFi and more! You'll depart from the City Centre at around 2.00pm, to head to Borambola Wines, about 25 minutes away. Upon arrival you'll be given an Informative Talk, Guided Tour and Wine, Cider & Beer tasting by the owner, Tim McMullen. Tim will tell you about the origins of the majestic and gracious Borambola Homestead, which is the main home on the property. Completed in the 1880s, Borambola has a long and colourful history. It was built by George Macleay, son of Alexander Macleay, the then Colonial Secretary, who built Elizabeth Bay House in Sydney. It was host to King Edward VIII when, as Prince of Wales, he visited Australia in 1920. Borambola reached its high point in the 1880s, when it was the centre of a pastoral empire of about 1.4 million acres, owned by John Donnelly. Borambola then passed through several hands and was finally purchased by F.W. Hughes, a famous figure on the Australian financial scene. He used the property to breed horses, including Hiraji, the 1947 Melbourne Cup Winner. In 1992 Borambola Homestead became the McMullen family home. During your visit to the Cellar Door, you'll have the opportunity to taste five different wines, as well as taste an apple cider and a boutique beer. The winery produces a range of quality varieties, including Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, Sparkling Brut, Rose, Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon. Prior to departing from Borambola, be sure to take a stroll and enjoy the picturesque surroundings. You'll depart at around 4.15pm, to return to the Hotel. After having time to relax and freshen up, you'll make way into the Hotel's One Morgan Street Restaurant, where you'll sit down to a Two-Course Pre-Ordered Dinner. For Main Course you'll have the choice of either Pork Cutlet with Apple & Sage Sauce, served on a Sweet Potato Mash, with Steamed Greens & Dutch Carrots or Herb-Crumbed Lamb Cutlets, served on a Creamy Potato Mash, Steamed Greens, and Gravy or Crispy Skin Atlantic Salmon Fillet, served with Fondant Potato, Steamed Greens, and a Chardonnay Sauce. For Dessert you'll have the choice of either Bread & Butter Pudding, served with Custard and Vanilla Ice-Cream, or Individual Chocolate Mousse, served with freshly-whipped Cream, and garnished with fresh Berries, or freshly-chopped Fruit Salad & Vanilla Ice-Cream. Self-Serve Tea & Coffee will then be available.

Day 4: Wednesday 26 April 2023 – Wagga Wagga, Junee, Yass Service Centre, Canberra, Queanbeyan

Inclusions: Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast, Entry & Informative Guided Tour at Junee Roundhouse Railway, Museum, Two-Course

All-You-Can Eat Buffet Lunch at Junee Ex-Services Club

After enjoying a **Full Hot & Cold Buffet Breakfast** in the Hotel's Restaurant between 6.30am and 8.30am, you'll board the coach and say 'goodbye' to Wagga Wagga and the Hotel, and head for the town of Junee. First stop will be the **Junee Roundhouse Railway Museum**. A railway roundhouse is a building with a circular or semicircular shape used by railways for servicing and storing locomotives. Most roundhouses also have a turntable, used for turning engines around. Today these are rarely required, as most diesel and electric engines can run equally well in either direction. The Junee Roundhouse came into service in 1947. When built, the 100-foot turntable was the largest in the Southern Hemisphere, and is now exceeded only by the 105-foot turntable at Thirlmere, Werris

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Creek and Broadmeadow. The Roundhouse is of brick construction and has 42 repair bays, a machine shop, and until the demise of steam in the early 1960's, had a large, elevated coal stage and a de-ashing pit. With the arrival of diesel power came dramatic changes to the workforce, especially in the trade areas. Boilermakers, blacksmiths and steamfitters were replaced by electricians and diesel fitters. In the years that followed its opening, additional sheds and structures were built, but were unsuitable for maintenance of future larger and more powerful locomotives. During the 48 years of Government railway operation, virtually every class of steam and diesel locomotive, self-propelled rail cars, modern XPT power cars and some interstate locomotives, received attention at the Junee Roundhouse. Today the Junee Railway Roundhouse is still used for its original purpose of servicing and re-conditioning locomotives and rolling stock, however half of it is now used as a Museum. After arriving at the Museum at around 9.30am, you'll be given an Informative Guided Tour, prior to having time to wander around. You'll depart from the Museum at around 10.40am to head to the Junee Licorice & Chocolate Factory. This family-owned business was established in 1998, when an abandoned 1935s flour mill was converted into a chocolate lover's paradise. It is now one of the region's most visited attractions! A wide range of products is available, including Organic Licorice, Raspberry Licorice, Rocky Road, Dark Chocolate Coated Strawberries, Milk Chocolate Coated Almonds, Coconut Rough, White Chocolate Coated Licorice, Triple Chocolate Coated Coffee Beans, Milk Chocolate Coated Hazelnuts, Milk Chocolate Coated Sultanas, White Chocolate Coated Raspberry Licorice, Chocolate Freckles, Milk Chocolate Coated Bananas, and many, many more varieties! Is your mouth watering yet? If not, it will be during your visit! Upon arrival you'll have around 40 minutes to browse in the gift shop and chocolate shop - you're sure to be tempted! After departing from this popular tourist attraction at around 11.25am, you'll head down the road to the Junee Ex-Services Club, where, upon arrival at around 11.30am, you'll make your way into the Club's Chinese Restaurant, to enjoy an All-You-Can-Eat Buffet Lunch. The Buffet will consist of Dim Sims, Mini Spring Rolls, Cantonese Chicken, Mongolian Beef, Sweet & Sour Pork, Honey Chicken, Special Fried Rice, Chicken Schnitzel, Chips and Gravy. If this Buffet is not to your taste, a plated meal consisting of Grilled Fish, Chips and Salad will be available, however this will have to be ordered prior to the departure of the tour. Following the Buffet, freshly chopped Fruit Salad and Ice-Cream will be served. You'll depart from the Club at around 12.45pm, and head to the Yass Service Centre, where you'll say "goodbye" to your Sydney and Central Coast-based friends, and leave the Main Coach. Before boarding the Feeder Vehicle to be conveyed back to your home, you'll have the opportunity to use the restrooms and grab a refreshment or two. After completing your rest stop and boarding the Feeder Vehicle, you'll be conveyed back to the point where you joined the tour last Sunday morning. Most Canberra & Queanbeyan-based passengers will return to their homes between 4.15pm and 5.30pm.
